

# BEST LAWN FEEDS

#### Best Lawn Fertilizer - Reviews

I did a quick survey and the results were:

- 1) Scotts Lawn Builder™ Plus Organics Lawn Food + Soil Improver
- 2) Yates Dynamic Lifter Soil Improver & Plant Fertiliser
- 3) CK88 Fertiliser is a great all round lawn & garden fertilizer, a NPKS fertiliser blend.
- 4) A Weed 'n' Feed from one of the many name brands, Yates, Scotts, Munns, EARTHCORE or similar to suite your lawn type.
- 5) Lawn clippings mulched in while you mow, a natural way.

Fertilizer is made from three nutrients and filler - Nitrogen - Phosphorus - Potassium So look for lawn feeds that contain these.



### **LAWN GRUBS**

#### Lawn grubs (Army Worms)

Lawn grubs aka Army worms don't generally kill a lawn, but their feeding will badly damage it and, if untreated, patches of your lawn may die, so it's important to restore growth as soon as possible. You can destroy the grubs with an insecticide like (Yates Baythroid Lawn Grub and Garden Insecticide) applied in the afternoon then add nutrients (make sure it's high in nitrogen, which encourages green growth) and several deep waterings a week, rather than more frequent light waterings. ## MUST HAVE YARD TOOLS

### How to trim lawn edges perfectly every time!

A String Trimmer: No other lawn and garden tool makes more sense than the string trimmer. The minimal amount of effort required to trim a swath of grass and edge your entire yard. Petrol or electric it's a must have for a clear, crisp, and well-defined yard.

EzySNIP: Hard to reach grass growing up your internal corners is the bane of the well-kept lawns. Trimming this grass has always been until now a physical action, bending, kneeling & manually cutting the grass from the corner with clippers; or hacking away with your string trimmer. Cordless Blower: You may think it's not a must-have, but if you try a cordless blower, you will be pleasantly surprised by the range of number of its uses. It's tough to beat the convenience and portability Pruning Shears: Pruning Shears are one of the most useful garden tools you'll find yourself using.
